Chronic Pain and Addiction: Participants will learn about how chronic pain can lead to addiction, the differences between someone with chronic pain who is addicted and the person with chronic pain who is “only” physiologically tolerant. The DSM IV TR to DSM 5 transition will be discussed as the section on substance has changed to accommodate chronic pain folks. Ways to assess and treat these issues will also be reviewed. Participants will gain an understanding of what leads a chronic pain client to overuse. Participants will gain an understanding of the differences between the chronic pain addict and the person with a tolerance to medication. Assessment and Treatment will be reviewed

Jennifer Haywood, LISW, LICDC has been a clinical social worker and addiction specialist since 1996. She received her Master’s in Social Work from The Ohio State University and her chemical dependency specialty through her internship at the Addiction Recovery Center at Harding Hospital in Worthington, Ohio. Since 2003, Jennifer has been adjunct teaching at The Ohio State University in the Bachelors of Science Social Work (BSSW) and in the MSW programs with a specialty in diagnosis, theory, mental health and addictions practice classes. Jennifer has also taught at Columbus State Community College and at Capital University. Jennifer has been training helping professionals since 1998. Jennifer has a private practice in Worthington, Ohio where she specializes in treating addictions and alcoholism, families of those with addictions, depression, anxiety, post-partum women, women’s issues, adolescent issues (14+) and relationship struggles.

Objectives

- Recognize the potential risks involved with long term treatment of chronic pain and what leads a chronic pain client to overuse
- Identify the magnitude of the current opiate addiction problem in Ohio and nationally
- Describe ways to distinguish between addiction and tolerance to opiates as a result of years of use for chronic pain
- Identify treatment techniques including alternatives to medications to reduce pain

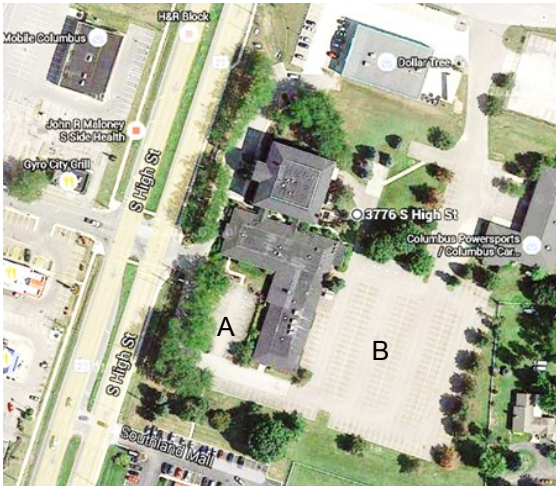
