I Can't Forget It: Working with Traumatized Older Adults Over the last decade there has been increasing evidence to support the tragic effect that trauma can have in our lives. Although much of this research has explored the impact of trauma on the lives of military service personnel, children, and sexual assault survivors there is mounting evidence that supports the disheartening reality of traumatic effects on older adults. This training will highlight the effects that trauma can have on older adults. An overview of the recent changes in the diagnostic criteria of Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) will be offered with specific focus on how these diagnostic principles apply to the aging population. Diagnostic indicators and appropriate assessment will further be discussed to empower professionals when serving this population. Specific strategies will be provided to assist social service professionals in advocating for competent services to these vulnerable consumers. Information on the Franklin County CARES Coalition will be shared.

Speakers *Dr. Brian L. Bethel* is a Professional Clinical Counselor-Supervisor (PCC-S), a Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor (LCDC III), and a Registered Play Therapist-Supervisor (RPT-S) with specialized training in counseling children, adolescents, and families. Dr. Bethel earned a PhD in Counselor Education and Supervision from Ohio University where he also obtained dual Master's degrees in Clinical Counseling and Rehabilitation Counseling. With over twenty years of experience, Dr. Bethel brings a diversity of clinical strengths to his counseling practice. Dr. Bethel's competencies have developed through both his educational achievements and his professional experiences. He has provided counseling services to children, adolescents, and adults who have been impacted by trauma. As the senior therapist for a nationally accredited child advocacy center, Dr. Bethel often provides expert testimony in child sexual abuse cases, clinical mental health topics, and serves as a clinical consultant for numerous agencies in the area of the impact of trauma. As the founder and director of Interplay Counseling and Consultation Services, Dr. Bethel has offered therapeutic services to many individuals who have been affected by traumatic experiences. He has been invited and presented at the local, state, national, and international level and has developed and facilitated numerous workshops in a variety of venues. Dr. Bethel is a published author who has offered contributions to the field in the area of child sexual abuse, childhood trauma and clinical practice.

Lynn Dobb, LSW has worked at the Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging since 1992. She is the Education and Training Manager for the agency and is a Caregiver Advocate in the National Family Caregiver Support program. During her years with COAAA she has been involved in numerous projects dedicated to educating professionals, older adults, families and students about issues on aging. Lynn has a Masters degree in Social Work from The Ohio State University and holds a certificate in Human Services Leadership from the College of Social Work. As a member of the Columbus CARES Coalition she recently received her Trauma Responsive Care Certification through the Tristate Trauma Network. She has been a Community Lecturer for the College of Social Work at The Ohio State University. She is a licensed social worker in the State of Ohio.

- Discuss Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and its impact on older adults
- Describe symptoms commonly associated with older adults who have confronted traumatic experiences
- Recognize the neurobiological consequences of trauma
- Identify strategies and evidenced-based treatment options for older adults who can be empowered through trauma sensitive interventions


LATE REGISTRATION: \$65.00 (after 5/2/18)
