It's Not the Brady Bunch- Family Dynamics of Addiction Addiction has long been recognized as a disease that can have devastating effects on an individual's life. While the impact of addiction has tragic consequences for the addict, substance use disorders often has ripple effects for the family and loved ones of an addict. Tragically, living with or caring for an addict precipitates trauma for all family members. This curriculum will highlight the disease of addiction as it impacts family members and those associated with persons with substance use disorders. Specific characteristics will be addressed that are commonly identified in families of addiction. In addition, participants will gain strategies to empower those consumers who have family members confronting addiction.

Speaker

Dr. Brian L. Bethel is a Professional Clinical Counselor-Supervisor (PCC-S), a Licensed Chemical Dependency Counselor (LCDC III), and a Registered Play Therapist-Supervisor (RPT-S) with specialized training in counseling children, adolescents, and families. Dr. Bethel earned a PhD in Counselor Education and Supervision from Ohio University where he also obtained dual Master's degrees in Clinical Counseling and Rehabilitation Counseling. With over twenty years of experience, Dr. Bethel brings a diversity of clinical strengths to his counseling practice. Dr. Bethel's competencies have developed through both his educational achievements and his professional experiences. He has provided counseling services to children, adolescents, and adults who have been impacted by trauma. As the senior therapist for a nationally accredited child advocacy center, Dr. Bethel often provides expert testimony in child sexual abuse cases, clinical mental health topics, and serves as a clinical consultant for numerous agencies in the area of the impact of trauma. As the founder and director of Interplay Counseling and Consultation Services, Dr. Bethel has offered therapeutic services to many individuals who have been affected by traumatic experiences. He has been invited and presented at the local, state, national, and international level and has developed and facilitated numerous workshops in a variety of venues. Dr. Bethel is a published author who has offered contributions to the field in the area of child sexual abuse, childhood trauma and clinical practice.

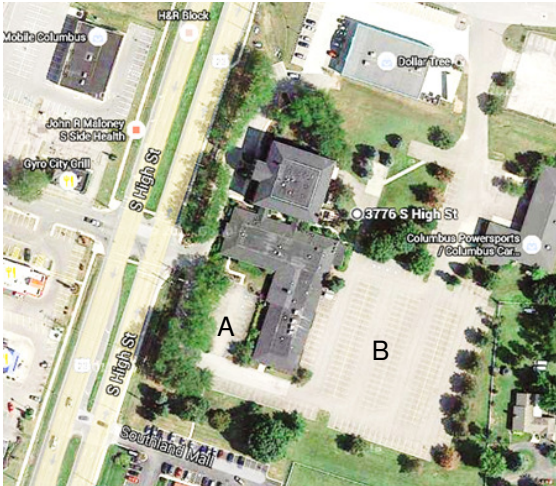
LATE REGISTRATION: \$65.00 (after 8/23/17)
