Medicaid Fraud- A Primer for Case Managers Medicaid fraud impacts the vulnerable clients served by many social service organizations. When the program is abused and dollars are not accounted for it puts clients at risk. This program will illuminate case managers working in programs supported by Medicaid on the ways in which fraud occurs and the mechanisms that are in place to combat abuse of the system.

Speakers

Meghan K. Duvall is the Director of Program Integrity at the Ohio Department of Medicaid. In this role, she supervises ODM's Bureau of Program Integrity, which is responsible for identifying and combatting fraud, waste, and abuse throughout Ohio's Medicaid Program. Prior to this role she served as Deputy Legal Counsel for ODM. Ms. Duvall works with various partner state agencies, including the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities, Ohio Department of Aging, Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and the Managed Care Plans. She is a graduate of The Ohio State University and Capital University Law School.

Lloyd Early is the Special Agent-In –Charge in the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit of the Ohio Attorney General's Health Care Fraud Section. He is a graduate of The Ohio State University with a double major in Finance and Economics. He has over twenty-eight years of law enforcement experience including service as a Special Deputy Sheriff and service to Ohio Attorney General as an Investigator, an Ohio Organized Crime Investigation Commission Task force Agent, a Special Agent, a Special Agent Supervisor, and an Assistant Executive Director for the Ohio Peace Officer Training Commission.

Kristy Wathen is the Program Manager for the Ohio Department of Medicaid's Electronic Visit Verification (EVV). Kristy has over 17 years in law enforcement, several of which include investigating home health fraud. Kristy came to ODM in fall of 2016 and has worked closely with the project team in developing the EVV System and is now managing the EVV Program. Kristy earned her Master of Science in Criminal Justice from Bowling Green State University. She is passionate about individuals receiving the services they need and believe every dollar lost to fraud, waste, or abuse equals a life negatively impacted.

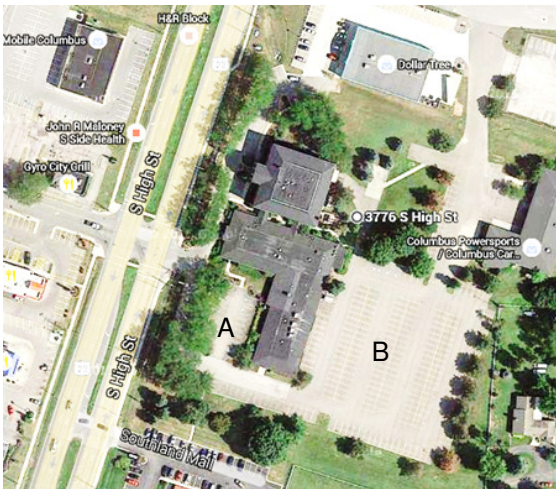
LATE REGISTRATION: \$70.00 (after 10/3/18)
