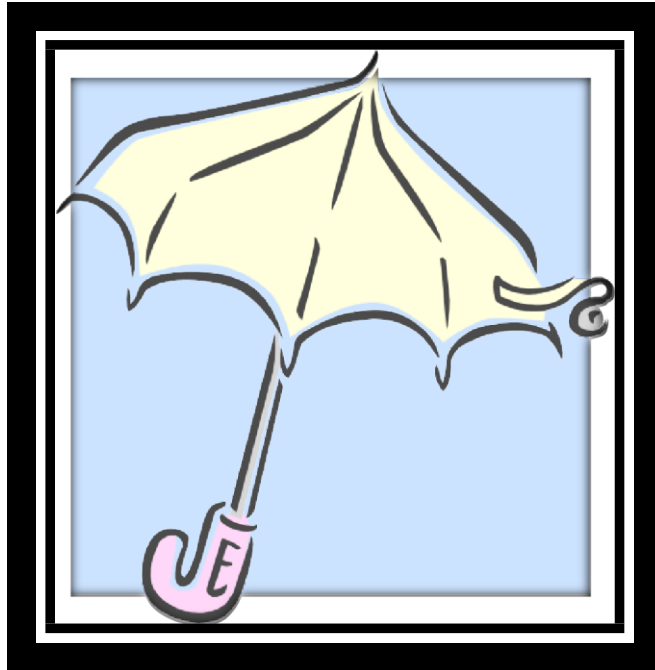


CENTRAL OHIO HOMELESS RESOURCES

Permanent Supportive Housing

Housing For Persons Who Experience Homelessness and/or Have A Disability

- According to HUD, Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) is permanent housing with indefinite leasing or rental assistance paired with supportive services to assist homeless persons with a disability or families an adult or child member with a disability achieve housing stability. PSH is decent, safe and affordable housing for persons experience homelessness and who also have a disability.
- Point of entry into these programs is through the Community Shelter Board shelter system. Applicant must have be homeless, living in emergency shelter or transitional housing or exiting an institution where the individual resided for 90 days.
